HIGHLIGHT PROJECTS

Iftaar Kits Distribution

In 2019, United for Humanity (UFH) organized a Ramadan Iftar Kits distribution drive in 5 major states. UFH distributed nutritious food kits to homeless, destitute and impoverished families to help them avoid hunger during the holy month of Ramadan.

Winter Wear Distribution

Breaking the record of 118 years of cold winters, 2019 was particularly harsh. Homeless people suffered the most. Team UFH distributed 100+ blankets, 200+ warm essential clothes. Helped 60+ families.



Delhi Riot Relief

In the 2020 Delhi riots, the charitable organization UFH implemented a multi-phased approach to support the most vulnerable victims. This included providing immediate relief, conducting detailed surveys, and offering targeted long-term assistance to help families restart their livelihoods.



HIGHLIGHT PROJECTS

Blood Chain

UFH organized a highly successful blood donation camp that collected 96 units of blood, addressing shortages and raising awareness about the critical need for regular donations highlighting the power of collective action.

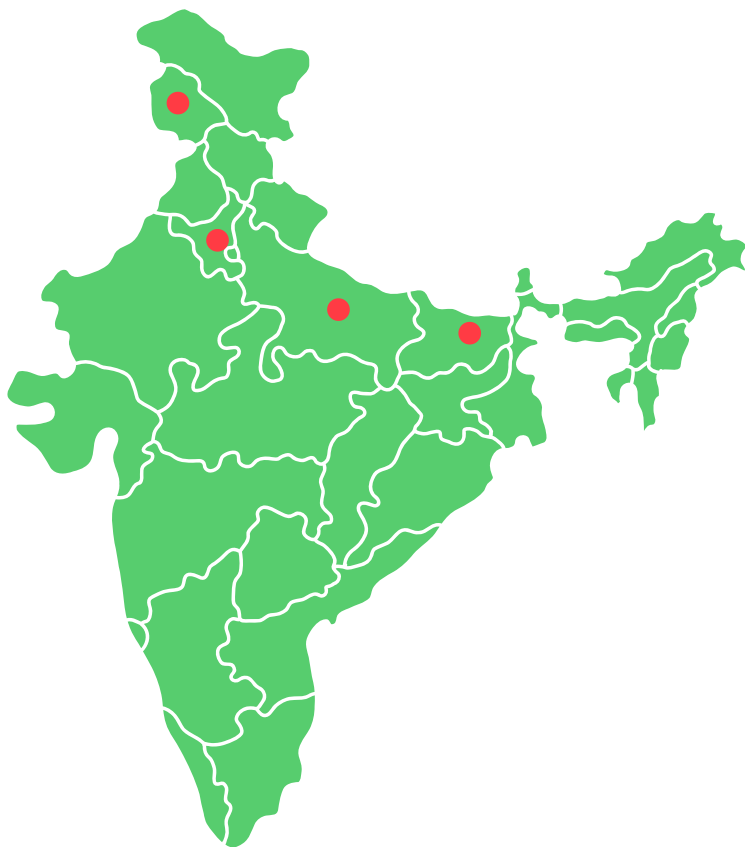


Eid Distribution

Spanning four major states, United for Humanity makes iftar accessible for all.

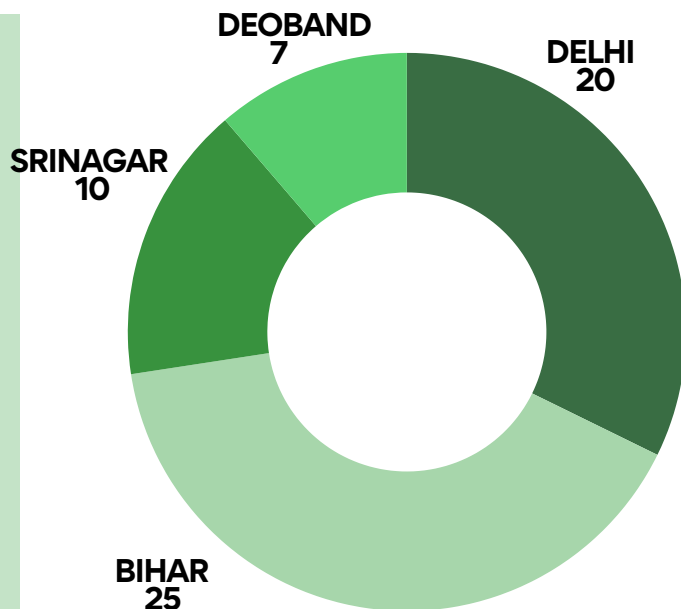


Ramadan is a time of spiritual reflection, increased charity and giving, known as "zakat" or "Sadaqah". The Prophet himself donated (ﷺ) Muhammad more to charity during this auspicious month than any other time of the year. Inspired by this spirit of generosity, UFH decided to distribute Iftar kits in 2019, marking their inaugural year, to make a meaningful contribution

To celebrate the fervour of the month, UFH hosted iftaar parties at orphanages in New Delhi and Kashmir. The orphans in Panzin village, Kashmir, were treated to dinner and Iftar by Team Kashmir. The hospitality and warm treatment received from the locals in the Kashmir Valley inspired the team to continue their work. This drive has strengthened UFH's resolve to uplift the marginalized and spread more joy in the years to come.

Despite limited experience and resources, UFH distributed kits to homeless, destitute and impoverished families, providing them with enough food to avoid hunger during the holy month of Ramadan across several states in India, including Delhi, Srinagar, Bihar, Deoband, and Kashmir.

The kits contained nutritious staples, along with sarees and mats; bringing smiles and helping them sustain for the holy month.

In the winter of 2020, Delhi NCR experienced record-breaking cold weather, with temperatures plummeting to levels not seen in over a century. For the homeless and those living in poor conditions, this harsh reality was a matter of life and death. Recognizing the urgent need to provide relief, UFH launched a blanket donation drive to ensure the most vulnerable had access to the warmth and protection they desperately required.

Team UFH sprang into action, surveying and visiting several locations across the national capital, including Nehru Place, Bhairon Mandir, Jamia Nagar, Tikona Park Slums, and Kalkaji Slums. Through their efforts, they were able to identify 60 families in dire need of assistance.

FROM RUINS TO RISING

THE 2020 DELHI RIOTS, ALSO KNOWN AS THE NORTH EAST DELHI RIOTS, WERE A SERIES OF VIOLENT COMMUNAL CLASHES IN NORTH EAST DELHI, BEGINNING ON FEBRUARY 26, 2020. THE RIOTS LEFT A TRAIL OF DESTRUCTION, CLAIMING LIVES AND SHATTERING THE DREAMS OF COUNTLESS FAMILIES.

FEBRUARY, 2020



UFH has played a crucial role in providing relief, restoring hope, and paving the way for long-term recovery. The epicentre of the riots was the working-class neighbourhoods of North East Delhi, home to a predominantly population of daily wage labourers and small business owners. Team UFH, understanding the gravity of the situation, started ground action which was a three phase project.




PHASE ONE

RECOGNIZING THE URGENT NEED FOR ASSISTANCE

(UFH), in collaboration with the Jamia Teachers' Association, immediately sprang into action by providing instant aid to over 200 families, delivering essential supplies such as food, clothing, medicine, and temporary shelters. The team also offered first-aid and other emergency services to those affected by the violence.

PHASE TWO

COMPREHENSIVE SURVEY



UFH then conducted a detailed on-ground survey, visiting the target areas and interacting with 70 families who had suffered immense losses. These families had lost loved ones, their homes, and their livelihoods. The survey employed a mix of qualitative and quantitative methods, gathering information on the specific needs and requirements of the victims.

PHASE THREE

REBUILDING AND RESTORATION

Based on the survey findings, UFH identified the 20 most vulnerable families who had lost everything, from their homes to their businesses. The organization then took steps to rejuvenate their livelihoods by renovating the damaged shops and providing the necessary support to help them rebuild their lives. UFH's commitment went beyond immediate care, as they worked tirelessly to ensure long-term sustainability for the affected families.

ARIF'S STORY: ONE OF THE MANY

Among the most affected were 20 families who lost everything in the violence. One such family was that of Arif, a tailor by profession who worked tirelessly to support his wife and three daughters. Arif's story is a testament to the resilience of the human spirit in the face of unimaginable adversity. When the mobs targeted Arif, they set his shop ablaze, destroying his livelihood and plunging his family into despair. Arif was left with no means to provide for his loved ones, his hopes and dreams reduced to ashes.

I DIDN'T HAVE ANY OTHER SOURCE OF INCOME AND MY FAMILY WOULD DIE OF HUNGER IF NO HELP REACHED ME," ARIF SHARED WITH OUR TEAM, HIS VOICE TREMBLING WITH THE WEIGHT OF HIS BURDEN. BUT IN THE DARKEST OF TIMES, A GLIMMER OF HOPE EMERGED.



The UFH team, recognizing the gravity of Arif's situation, sprang into action. They provided Arif with two sewing machines, enabling him to rebuild his business from the ground up. The team also renovated and painted his shop, restoring it to its former glory. Arif could once again start his business and earn a living for his family.

Victims of violence

need empathy, not judgment

Islamuddin, a resident of Shiv Vihar, Delhi, was a victim of the devastating 2020 riots. He had been running a small wood business, barely scraping by to support his family of nine. The violent unrest destroyed his livelihood and left him and his loved ones homeless.

In the aftermath of this tragedy, our team at UFH stepped in to help Islamuddin rebuild his life. He was provided with the essential equipment needed to restart his business, giving him the means to once again support his family. However, Islamuddin's struggle is far from over - he and his family currently reside in a temporary camp in Old Mustafabad, desperate for a safe, permanent living space.

United for Humanity urges the society to ensure that no one is left behind, and that families like that of Islamuddin have the resources to recover and thrive once more.



BLOOD CHAIN

Perturbed by the prevalence of medical negligence in society, team UFH. decided to take up a blood donation drive, with over 100 individuals donating blood, a total of 96 units collected, and 6 hospitals hand in hand, the drive was a resounding success.

The camp bore a multifaceted impact. From helping to address the shortage of blood in hospitals, to raising awareness about the importance and the need for regular donations, simultaneously highlighting the importance of collective action to ensure that the patients receive proper treatment.

The blood was collected at various locations in the national capital. Hospitals including Apollo Hospital, AIIMS, Al Shifa, Holy Family, Kailash Jain Hospital, GB panth were partnered in the initiative. These hospitals are renowned for their medical expertise and are well-equipped to provide high-quality care to patients. UFH maintained all official guidelines whilst sourcing the blood.



It serves as a testament to the power of non-governmental organisations in making a difference in the lives of those in need.

EID WITH UFH

Sharam Vihar slum area of New Delhi. struggles with fulfilling the basic necessities of life. The true essence of Eid celebrations had become lost for many children whose families had migrated from their hometowns in search of employment. Recognizing this, Team UFH stepped in to bring joy and restore the spirit of the festival through an Eid Clothes Distribution initiative.

The team visited the slum and identified children who had never experienced the excitement of new Eid clothes, as their families struggled to make ends meet.

For many, it was the first time they had the opportunity to dress up and feel the true joy of Eid. The initiative not only provided essential clothing but also restored a sense of belonging and cultural identity for the children. Through simple acts of generosity, Team UFH was able to make a meaningful difference in the lives of 100 children.

"Through this initiative, we aimed to bring joy and restore the true essence of Eid celebrations for these children, It was heartwarming to see the smiles on their faces and to know that we could make a difference, even in a small way.", said Tasneem Zafer, the Founder and General Secretary.

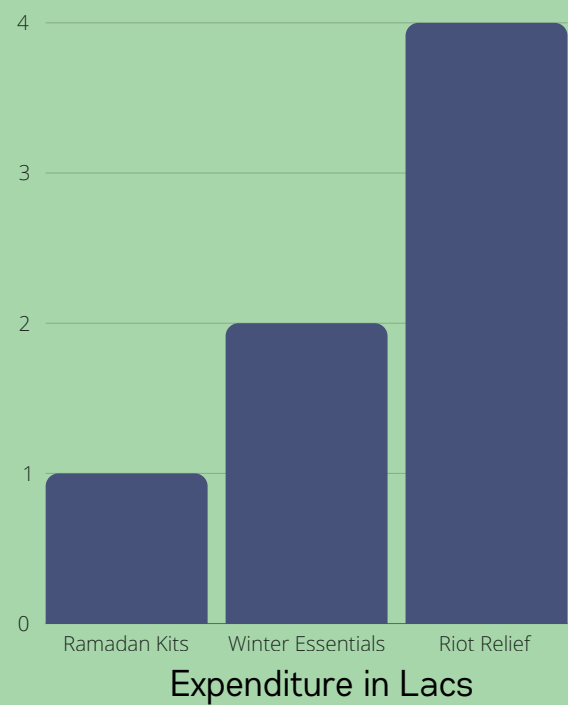
